### Purpose and Responsibility of SEPAC

- The Livingston Public Schools Special Education Parent Advisory Committee exists to fulfill the requirements of the New Jersey Administrative Code 6A:14-1.2(h):
  - "Each Board of Education shall ensure that a special education parent advisory group is in place in the District to provide input to the District on issues concerning students with disabilities."
- SEPAC works collaboratively with all special education parents and District staff in an advisory capacity to the District.
- Building level SEPACs are responsible for parent and building collaboration, leading building meetings, gathering questions to be answered, celebrating successes of students, families & special education in each school, and bringing important information about special education to the District.

### SEPAC 2022-2023 Executive Committee for the District

- 30 member committee with parents, general and special educators, supervisors, principals, directors, Assistant Superintendent, Superintendent, and Board of Education members represented.
- All Executive Committee SEPAC members have made the commitment to remain on the committee for two full years. This allows for continuity in the work of the committee.
- Committee members lead building based SEPAC meetings to celebrate successes, create open lines of communication, share information, consider questions about special education, and share information with the District on important questions regarding special education.
