

#### **New Course Process**




- Examine our current practices, developments in the field, NJSLS developments, and interest inventories

- Opportunity to spiral curriculum throughout the year and enhance the advisory and enrichment programs









### **Life Hacks & Habits**

  - What Color is Your Parachute for Teens by Richard Nelson Bolles







#### Dance 2 - LHS

- Dance has now been offered at LHS for two years
  - Dance 2 is designed as an extension
- Elective course in the TAP! Theatre Arts Pathway
- Fulfills annual Physical Education semester requirement
- Instruction will focus on increasing the understanding of individual style vernacular, clarity of movement, intention, and delivery of artistic intent.
- Genres such as ballet, modern, jazz, hip hop, and tap will be explored.
- Deeper focus will be placed on the choreographic process.
- Students will have the opportunity to work individually and collaboratively to design studies that integrate and combine movement vocabulary, choreographic devices, notation systems, and structures
